



PEDONG DEANERY HOLY CHILDHOOD CONVENTION 2024



The Pedong Deanery Holy Childhood Commission organized a three days' Convention at St. Margaret Mary Church, Barbot-Nimbong from 8th January to 11th January 2024 with the theme "The Sacraments of the Holy Catholic Church". Ranchi: Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Vincent Aind of Bagdogra, West Bengal as the new Archbishop of Ranchi Archdiocese. This was announced simultaneously on 30 December, at 12 noon from Vatican Rome and at 4.30 pm Indian time from Ranchi. In Ranchi, Archbishop Felix Toppo, in a meeting with the parish priests and major superiors of Ranchi at the Archbishop House, read out the letter received from Nunciature Delhi and announced the name of Bishop Vincent Aind in front of them

Archbishop Felix Toppo thanked all the priests and Major Superiors for their support during his tenure. He also called upon them to support the new Archbishop Vincent Aind. Archbishop Felix Toppo will continue to serve the Archdiocese of Ranchi as Apostolic Administrator until Bishop Vincent Aind takes over

"Empowering Lay People: CCBI's Canon Law Diploma Convocation Marks Milestone in Strengthening Synodal Church Participation"



Bangalore: In a very first initiative to empower lay people on canon law, the commission for canon law under the aegis of the Conference of Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI) conducted a one year annual diploma course in Canon Law from December 2022 to December 2023. This was aimed at empowering the lay people for their

communion, participation and mission in the life of the church to strengthen the Synodal way. The culmination of this impactful annual diploma programme saw the Convocation ceremony, held on Saturday, 3 February 2024 in Archbishops House Bangaluru, where participants were formally recognized for their dedication and achievements. Most Rev. Arulselvam Rayppan, in the inaugural session, underscored the necessity for Lay persons to acquire a profound understanding of canon law and further emphasized the instrumental role it plays in fulfilling parochial and diocesan responsibilities, guiding magisterium. All the participants were awarded Diplomas in Canon Law. His Eminence Cardinal Filipe Neri Feraro, the president of CBCI, awarded the certificates to the participants and emphasized the importance of Canon Law and its relevance for the lay people's participation, mission and co-responsibility in the life of the church. On the day of the convocation, two formative sessions were conducted. Rev Dr. John Mendonca DCL spoke of laypeople being co-responsible in the activities of the church in order to create a Synodal and emphasized the need for their proper formation for their synodal Participation. Most Rev. Alex Vadakumthala, Bishop of Kannur and a Canon Layer, mentioned the importance of the participatory structures, such as the Parish Pastoral

Council, Parish Finance Council, Diocesan Pastoral and Finance Council, Diocesan Synods, Diocesan Pastoral Council and other Commissions wherein the laypeople could commit themselves to render their mission and participation in order to blossom the Synodal church in India. Offering his heartfelt congratulations, His Eminence Filipe Neri Cardinal Feraro eloquently reaffirmed the crucial need for such initiatives, underscoring how equipping laypeople with knowledge of canon law empowers them to contribute meaningfully to the church and its participatory structures. Most Rev. Antony Savarimuthu (chairman Bishop of the Commission for Canon Law in CCBI) who delivered a compelling address stressing the paramount importance of lay involvement within the church and significance of Canon Law as an instrument of faith. A total of 437 lay People hailing from 23 countries across the globe embarked on this enriching journey. The teaching faculty for this course comprised Cardinals, Archbishops, Bishops, and renowned Professors of Canon Law from India and abroad, lending their valuable expertise to each session. Rev. Fr. Dr. Samuel Lepcha and Mr. Denis Lepcha had joined this course from the Diocese of Darjeeling. Mr. Denis Lepcha witnessed this convocation ceremony in Bangalore but Fr. Samuel could not do it due to his ill health. Mr. Denis who has completed his Theological Bachelor diploma course (2020-22) with Distinction and now with this Canon Law Diploma he has added one more feather in his Academic career.
