School, Pedong respectively. While in Pedong he had cordial relationship with all walks of life. People of Pedong wanted to pay respect to Late Fr. Rene Singh. Therefore, people of Pedong under the leadership of Dr. Jigmee Bhutia (ARD), Pedong, Late Rev. Fr. Rene Singh Memorial Foundation was started. The foundation organized the 1st Death Anniversary of Late Rev. Fr. Rene Singh on 9th May 2022. They had organized Holy Mass for the repose of the soul of Rev. Fr. Rene Singh. Open invitation was given for the mass. Many exstudents of Rev. Fr. Rene participated in the Mass from different parts of India and Nepal. The Main Celebrant of the Mass was Rt. Rev. Joseph Chettri, the Dean of Pedong Deanery declared the erection of two Quasi Parishes by reading the Decree given by the Bishop and the Chancellor then followed the installation of the First Parish Priest in the respective Places.

Gitdabling: After a gap of three years Bishop Stephen Lepcha visited St. Joseph's Church, Gitdubling. He reached on 30th April and joined in the felicitation of Mr.

Robert Lepcha a retired senior teacher of St. Joseph school Gitdubling. He had served the school for more than thirty years and will always be remembered as the most dedicated, committed and a noble teacher. Fathers, Sisters, Staff and students had organised a grand felicitation program in his honor.

After the program Bishop joined in the Parish Pastoral Council meeting at the parish hall. Fr. Thomas Urgen Lepcha the parish priest, Fr. Sebastian Lepcha the assistant parish Priest, Fr. Norbert Lepcha in charge of Longsheol Mission, Sr. Victoria S.J.C the Superior of St. Joseph convent and all the lay members of parish Pastoral Council were present. Members belonging to different commissions, SCC, PPC, Catholic Associations, Women, Youth and Holy childhood, read their annual reports. The parish priest gave the report of the construction of the new Church. The construction of the new Church is about to be completed. The entire expense of the construction of this church is born by the generous contribution from the local Catholic families. Each Catholic family is committed to contribute Rs.10000/- Rupees Ten thousand each. Bishop encouraged them saying that you have proved an act of faith in God. A christen hymn says. "Miracles can take place when you believe" and this has come true in this matter. After the meeting Bishop visited few elderly members of the parish and returned to priest resident at around 7.30 pm

On 1" May, Sunday, Parish celebrated the feast of St. Joseph the worker, the Patron saint of their parish. Solemn Mass was celebrated .24 candidates received the sacrament of confirmation. After the mass the faithful felicitated the Bishop by Lepcha traditional way by offering fruits, vegetables, eggs, hens etc. Bishops Vehicle was filled with their gifts. Bishop was overwhelmed by the love of the faithful.

Takdah 08.05.2022: As per the invitation of the Diocese of Darjeeling, Rev. Marcel Fernandes OCD, Provincial Leader of OCD Congregation arrived on Sunday morning from Dhupguri near Binaguri their head quarter in the Diocese of Jalpaiguri along with the following priests, Fr. Raphael Tudu OCD, the new in charge Parish, Fr. Leo Murmu OCD, the incoming in charge of Primary school, Fr. Joseph Shibu Fernandes OCD. Bishop called them for a short meeting before Mass with them, in presence of Fr. Prakash Rai, the outgoing Parish Priest and Fr.. Amar Rai the outgoing Assistant PP. He read out the short memorandum between OCD and the Diocese of Darjeeling to be followed during the term of two years of experimental basis. After the meeting, handing over and taking over of required parish parochial documents and inventory of the Church, Presbytery and the School was conducted.

Bishop introduced the OCD fathers to the faithful gathered in the Church and briefed them about their purpose of coming to Takdah parish, mainly to explore the possibility of up gradation of the School on public demand within 2-3 years time. Meanwhile they will look fatter the parish as well. The faithful traditionally welcome the OCD fathers at the beginning of the Holy Mass; Fr. Raphael Tudu OCD was solemnly installed as the new parish priest in the presence of entire faithful. Diocese has decided to bifurcate Teesta valley Mission from Takdah parish and Fr. Prakash Rai is appointed as the in charge of this new Mission.

St. Peter's Church, Gaucharan.

Bishop arrived St. Peter's Church, Gaucharan East Sikkim in the afternoon of 14.05.2022. Parish youth ICYM unit of this parish welcomed Bishop solemnly. He was requested to bless and inaugurate the majestic and beautiful Bishop's Room inside the Priest's resident built by Fr. Stephen Gyan with the generous contribution by the Parishioners. It was unique and first time that happened in the life of 25 years of Bishops Episcopate ministry that the parish made a special room for Bishop in the Diocese of Darjeeling-Sikkim. Lunch, Dinner, and next day's breakfast, lunch was prepared by youth for priest, and sisters. Bishop expresses his sincere thanks to Vivek Rai the President and all the Parish youth for their exclusive genuine love and concern. Sincere thanks also to the Parishioners for their love and respect for their shepherd. Umpteen thanks to Fr. Stephen Gyan the parish priest for his animating leadership. After lunch Bishop participated in the Parish Pastoral Council meeting in which whole parish report was read out. As per the Parish report, normal parish pastoral activities are going on. SCC meeting is picking up slowly after the lock-down due to Covid-19. Faith formation, regular Sunday Catechism for children (Saturday) is also regularizing in systemic way. Parish managing committee is being officially approved by the Government. So they were able to register the parish land in this committee's name on behalf of the parish whichwas pending for a long time. In the parish plan of actions, one is to make a unique "Calvary Dara" pilgrim centre for all Christens for East Sikkim with the financial help from the present Government.

15.05.2022: Early Sunday morning bishop visited the original old parish in Gaucharan where gave Holy Communion to Edward Lepcha a retired teacher and his wife, Mrs. Peter Santujit Rai the fist catholic members. Late Peter Santujit was a first convert and very close to Missionary priests. They were like one family. He remained ever faithful and always supportive to all the priests. His legacy is carried over by his son Mr. Patrick a Government Officer in Sikkim. Bishop was invited by Dominic Rai and his family who offered high breakfast. Bishop visited also Mr. Paul Karna Rai a builder who was not well on that day. Finally he arrived Church exactly on time before Mass. Culmination of Bishop's visit was the solemn Eucharistic celebration with the faithful, sharing the good news on Sunday. Parish church was almost full to the capacity. Liturgy, Choir was well organized with the help of Cluny sisters and the youths of the parish. Miss. Leonie Malmith Lepcha received both Holy Communion and Confirmation from Bishop. St. Peters Church (parish) established 1977, was founded by late Missionary priest Jean-Marie Brahier CR. He tirelessly worked for the development of local people, by way of establishing the cooperative society. He adapted the local culture and the language. He was indeed a walking Jesus for the people. May he Rest in Peace seeing the spiritual progress of the mission he started.

Sangsay: Bishop arrived Sangsay on 21.05.2022:. He offered Mass for the SCN sisters' community at Nazareth Lee Convent. Sr. Arpita SCN Superior, Sr. Jyoti SCN and Sr. Stanilau SCN are members of this community. After closing down St. Dominic School, sisters are keeping themselves busy with

other social and pastoral work in the parish. Sr. Jyoti who is a nurse is collaborating with Hayden hall Darjeeling conducting health awareness program and reaching out to the sick and needy people in entire village of Sangsay. There are five trained paramedics under the super vision of Hayden hall. Sisters are involved in social developmental work. The Financial sustenance of Sangsay is fully dependant on agriculture. Though the cultivating land is rocky, dry and stony, people somehow cultivate Brooms, Ginger, Chilly, and rear animals, low cost poultry farm, cow diary etc. Sisters try to organise the farmers and find the market to get normal valuable prices for their product. Besides these they go out with the cathechist and the parish priest go wherever there are Village Mass. Their presence is certainly making an impact in the parish. Listening their pastoral ministry, bishop noticed that despite all these good things happening but biggest challenge for their sustenance remains worrisome. They want to do good but how?

22.05.2022: Outgoing parish priest of St. Dominic Church, Sangsay Fr. Augustine Subba had invited Bishop for the pastoral visit. His reports are as follows; there total 100 families. There are two substations, Our lady of Lourdes Chapel at Pathong and one at Tarkhola on the National Highway to Gangtok. This substation is now being looked after by senior Fr. Jerome Singh from Gianora Home. It is divided into 9 SCC units. The Catholic Associations are affiliated DDCA, Mata Samaj, Youth, Holy Childhood, remain quite active. PPC is dissolved before lock-down due to Covid-19. The Parish Finance Committee is existing. Parish priest feels that faithful need training on PPC, PFC and other Associations as since they remain always uncertain about these Church bodies, the faithful are responsible in general. Fr. Augustine Organisms two retreats annually in Advent and one in Lenten Seasons. Group recollections are held once in three months regularly. Novena is conducted SCC wise and way of the Cross conducted SCC family wise. During Advent and Lenten season Holy Mass is being offered SCC wise. Mass is offered in the substation once a month mass for the community. It's a huge parish distance wise. Our lady of Lourdes Pathong substation is closer to Kalimpong town then Sansay parish. Because the distance it may be wiser tobe annexed with Mary Mother of God Church or St. Anthony Church Kilatar Homes or make it Quasi parish. Bishop wants to visit this substation soon along with Dean of Kalimpong and other priests as well as send a team of lay people from Kalimpong for this genuine need of the community.

Sonada - 28.05.2022: On kind invitation of Sr. Sherin H.C. the headmistress of Holy Crosse Girls Higher Secondary School Sonada. It was an opportunity for the Bishop to join with the Holy Cross sisters, past and present Staff members, Guardians, Parents and the students to thank all the visionaries Like pioneering Holy Cross sisters and late Fr. Luiii Jellici sdb and late Bishop Eric Benjamin who thought of starting a good school, empowering the local Girls . The best way to celebrate its golden jubilee was to have solemn Eucharistic celebration thanking God firstly for his abundant graces blessed upon for the last fifty years. It was indeed a grace-filled moment. The School beautiful hall was packed with the students, their parents and all invited local dignitaries. The Headmistress in her inaugural address left no stone unturned to remember all personnel involved in the progress of thisInstitution, including all those Government officials who granted recognition of this school and also D.I, local Government official for their continuus support and financial support especially for the salary of the staff members. She also heighlighted the vision and mission of the education of the congregation of the Holy cross Society after the heart of the heart of Founder and Foundress Fr. Theodosius Florentini and Mother Maria Theresa Scherer of Switzerland. Tea leaves congratulates Sr. Blasia H.C.
