The closing ceremony of the 125 years jubilee celebration of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception was held on 8th December 2018 on the feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. It was a day of great thanksgiving and jubilation for the people of Darjeeling. The event commenced with the Eucharistic Celebration. The main celebrant was Bishop Stephen Lepcha who offered the Thanksgiving mass along with Fr. Samuel Lepcha, the Vicar General, Fr. Alexander Gurung, the Pro- vicar, Fr. Edward Sangnes, the Co-pastor and other priests. The faithful of the parish as well as from neighbouring parishes were present in large numbers along with religious sisters from different congregations. It may be recalled that the Catholic Church first came to Darjeeling with the Irish Loreto nuns and thereafter by the grace of God and the spiritual zeal of the early fathers the Church has grown. Bishop Eric Benjamin, the first Bishop of the Diocese devoted his life in serving his faithful and today Bishop Stephen continues to guide his flock with the same dedication.

As part of the celebration the Nepali Catholic Sahityik Sangh released the Souvenir magazine and the diocesan biannual magazine 'Bagdo Jharna' This was also a day when the parishioners above 70 years of age were felicitated for their lifelong contribution to the parish. 8th December being the 21st episcopal anniversary of Bishop Stephen and the 19th ordination anniversary of Fr. Alexander there was even more reason to be grateful to God. The event came to an end with Agape.

DDCA/ MINORITY CENTRAL COMMITTEE crucial meeting held.

It is often felt that whenever Minority issues prop up in the Catholic Community we are not able to tackle the situation which yields satisfying results that benefits the Catholic community as a whole in the Diocese of Darjeeling due to lack of co-ordination and communication as far as Minority issues are concerned.

On the 6th of November DDCA/Minority Central Committee was formed, during the meeting of DDCA in Kalimpong .Rt.Rev.Bishop Stephan. Rev Fr. Michael Lepcha [Sr]. Rev. Fr.Prakash Rai ,Mr. Patrick Sada,President DDCA, Mr.Prakash Thomas Thapa, General Secretary all the executive members and representative from various parishes were present. The core objective of the committee is to look into the matters pertaining to Religious Minority issues at the National, State and local level.

The First issue taken up by the committee after its formation was the issue of the houses being built through West Bengal Paharia Minority Board in which Catholic community is also one of the beneficiaries besides others .Unfortunately it was found out during the survey made by the members of

DDCA/MCC that in St. John Berchmans Parish out of 12 houses sanctioned by the Government only 2 has been completed and rest 10 is yet to be completed even after a span of 1 year[Construction began in Dec 2017].The conditions of the beneficiaries are miserable and are living like refugees in their own home village due to indifferent attitude of the WBPMB .Furthermore the funds allocated for the purpose and deposited in individual beneficiaries Account Pass book has been withdrawn without proper information to the beneficiaries.

DDCA/MCC in its meeting held on the 24th of Nov .2018 at DDCA's registered office Darjeeling, passed a resolution directing the present WBPMB, Government nominated Board member Mr. Anthony Yonzon, to look into the matter without further delay and get the incomplete houses of our people completed by 15th of December, failing to do so DDCA/MCC will move the matter further to higher authorities until and unless justice is done to the deprived and needy Catholic families.

Nominated Member WBPMB Kurseong were present for the meeting. Mr. P.Sada Chaired the Meeting.

7th Regional Youth Convention 2018

The 7th Regional Convention was held in Don Bosco High School, Krishnagar from 16th -19th October 2018, the theme being "Young People the Faith and Vocational Discernment. About 500 youth participated in this Convention. The program commenced with the Flag hoisting ceremony as we were gracious to have Rt Rev Archbishop Thomas D'Souza, Rt. Rev Joseph Gomes, Rt Rev Cyprian Monis and Fr. Deepak Thomas, OCD who marked the beginning of this event which was followed by the Holy Eucharistic celebration. The diocese of Krishnagar had prepared a beautiful programme to welcome all the delegates of the 8 dioceses of West Bengal & Sikkim Region. The day ended with a cultural program put up by the eight dioceses showcasing their culture. Each day different diocese was given charge of the Eucharistic celebration and it was melodious to hear choirs singing in different languages. Each day had a theme to make the Convention more meaningful. The Themes for the various days were:

1. Love of God
2. Listening to the Call
3. Discerning the Call
4. Living the Call

The sessions were given by Sr. Seli who informed the youth about the legal aspects of Anti Human Trafficking, POXCO and RTI. The second session was given by Mr Simon John who spoke about Faith A Gratuitous Gift of God. Fr. Kanauf of Baraipur Diocese spoke on Vocational Discernment. A panel discussion chaired by Rt Rev Bishop Joseph Gomes, Fr. Ongshu Gayen, Ms Jacqueline Gayen, Mr Sushanto and Sr Meena D'costa who spoke on Young People, the Faith and Vocational Discernment. The sessions helped the youth to clarify their doubts and grow stronger in their faith. Taize prayer and confessions also helped the youth to walk a step closer to Jesus. Each day different diocese animated the youth before the sessions.

The youth of all the eight dioceses had put up food stalls presenting the delicacies of their own diocese. Each one enjoyed the different flavours and colours presented by them. A Bible Quiz on the Gospel of Luke & ICYM helped the youth to study the Gospel and there was close competition between the teams. There were events such as Fashion Show and a Minute to Fame where the youth showcased their Talents.

The Convention ended on a good note, the delegates enjoyed the food and the stay they were able to meet and learn about different cultures and moreover grow an extra mile on their faith to inspire others and take Jesus with them.
