Ordination of Seven Priests for the Diocese of Darjeeling Kalimpong – 9th May 2025



In a momentous and grace-filled celebration, the Diocese of Darjeeling witnessed the ordination of seven new priests on Friday, 9th May 2025, at St. Augustine's School hall in Kalimpong. The sacred ceremony was presided over by His Excellency Most Rev. Stephen Lepcha, Bishop of Darjeeling, and was concelebrated by a large number of priests from across the diocese and neighboring regions.

The seven ordinands—Rev. Alphonse Ghimirey, Benai Chettri, Clinten Rock Lepcha, Joachim Tamang, Marcus Lepcha, Silas Lepcha and Sion Rai were solemnly presented

before the congregation of religious, laity, and well-wishers who had gathered in large numbers to witness and bless this sacred milestone in the lives of the young men dedicating themselves to the service of God and the Church.

The liturgy was marked by deep spiritual fervor, traditional rites, and a profound sense of community. The bishop, in his homily, reflected on the priestly vocation as a call to selfless service, humility, and pastoral dedication, especially within the unique cultural and spiritual context of the hills.

The atmosphere was one of joy and thanksgiving, with devotional hymns led by the wonderful choir of St Teresa's Church, enhancing the solemnity of the occasion. The participation of the faithful, representatives from various parishes, and family members of the newly ordained made the event truly communal and celebratory.

Following the ordination rite, a felicitation program was held, during which the newly ordained priests were congratulated. The event concluded with a fellowship meal, reflecting the unity and joy of the diocesan family.

The ordination of these seven young men marks a significant chapter in the history of the Diocese of Darjeeling, symbolizing hope, renewal, and the continued growth of the church.

25 Years of Silver Jubilee Celebration of St. Joseph's Church, 5th Mile, Kalimpong.



The day started with paying homage with the prayer and lighting a candle to the departed soul of Pope Francis, in the auspicious presence of Bishop Stephen Lepcha accompanied by the (Parish Priest) Fr.

John Bannarjee. There was holy mass Presided over by Bishop Stephen, felicitation with the token of love for the Father's Sisters & Belivers who had contributed during the foundation of the Church.

Church History in Brief

The vision for St. Joseph's Church began with Late Bishop Eric Benjamin, the first Bishop of Darjeeling Diocese. During his pastoral visits, he noticed the hardship faced by Catholic families walking 4 kilometers from 3rd Mile to St. Teresa's Church at 8th Mile for Sunday Mass. Moved by their dedication, he envisioned a new church closer to them.

Around the same time, Fr. Joseph Hoppstetter C.R., the then Parish Priest of St. Teresa's, also dreamt of establishing a church between the 5th and 6th Mile areas. In 1995, Rev. Fr. Thomas D'Souza (now Archbishop of Calcutta) authorized the purchase of land for the church and presbytery. Fr. Jerome Singh, then Parish Priest, was tasked with finding suitable land.


After initial setbacks in Tashiding Busty, a plot in Ngassey Busty, 5th Mile, was found. However, the land being tribal made acquisition challenging. A complaint was filed in July 1995 against building on tribal land. Eventually, in July 1997, the land was legally purchased in the name of Fr. Gregory Lepcha, and the deed and mutation were completed the same year.

Despite community opposition and even incidents of stone-pelting at night, Fr. Jerome Singh courageously continued the construction. By late 1999, the Church of St. Joseph was completed and stood as a testament to perseverance and faith.

On 18th November 2000, the church was officially dedicated by Bishop Stephen Lepcha, who initiated monthly Eucharistic celebrations there. In 2002, upon recommendation from Fr. Pius Marcus, the church was declared a Quasi-Parish, and Late Rev. Fr. Andrew Sada was appointed its first Parish Priest on 7th July 2002, serving 52 families.

On 26th June 2009, Bishop Stephen Lepcha handed over the church to the Society of Jesus (Darjeeling Province). Fr. Andrew Sada celebrated his last Mass there on 28th June 2009.
